

## Guidelines for Abstract Preparation

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### Abstract

This article serves as the template for abstract (two page) for all abstracts submitted to the Fiftieth Anniversary Gemmological Research Symposium-2021, Gemmologists Association of Sri Lanka (GASL). To ensure a uniform format all authors must use this template when preparing abstracts. The abstract must be submitted in electronic form to the editorial board ([info@gemmology.lk](mailto:info@gemmology.lk)) on or before the deadlines given. The abstracts must be prepared in MS Word (encourage to use version 2007 or above). This could be a summary of the whole project including major findings (maximum 2 pages). Include a statement of the purpose of your study, the research methods/methodology used to arrive at your results and/or conclusions, the results observed, the conclusions drawn from your study. If necessary, one figure or table of the most important could be included with the page limit. The abstract should include a Title; information of Author(s) and Affiliation(s); the email address of Corresponding Author; Abstract itself. Illustrative materials such as tables, figures are allowed. Essential acknowledgements are also encouraged. Throughout the abstract, use Calibri Light font with 1.5 spacing between lines. The recommended font size is 13 pts for the title; 12 pts for author names; 11 pts for affiliations and 12 pts for the main text/Key words/Acknowledgements. The main text should be justified on both sides. Please do not use footnotes. The length of the abstract should not exceed two A4 page (word count of approximately 600-750 words). Other specific guidelines for each section are given below.

1. Title: Please provide a descriptive title of the abstract. The title should be concise. Use boldface for the title. Please do not capitalise the entire title.

2. Authors and Affiliations: Include the surnames, initials of all authors in boldface. The name of the corresponding author should be marked with a superscripted asterisk mark (\*) and respective e-mail of the corresponding author should be given as shown above. The affiliations of all the authors should be included with different superscripted letters (a; b; c ....etc.) when they are different.

3. Abstract: The text of the abstract must be followed with a statement of the research problem, a brief description of the methods, the major findings of the study, a brief discussion of the results and a short sentence on the main conclusion(s). The main text may be divided into different paragraphs as necessary.

4. Illustrative materials: The essential table or figure is allowed.

5. Acknowledgements: Any essential acknowledgement can be included at the end of the main body of the abstract. (Authors thank the support from the xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx)

6. Keywords: Provide up to 5 keywords, separated by semi-colons in alphabetical order.
